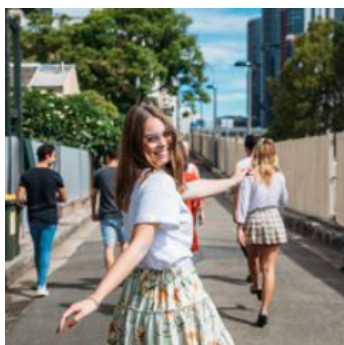
[Pathways to Your Dream Degree](#)

Applying for uni next year but worried that you won't meet the ATAR requirements for your dream degree? Most institutions offer pathway options for applicants who don't meet the standard entry criteria for their courses. Often, you'll be able to find a different avenue into the course you're aiming for.

If you don't get an offer into your chosen degree because you haven't met the required lowest selection rank, you could start an alternative undergraduate course with a lower entry rank. Once you've successfully completed the first year of that degree, and have results that will improve your selection rank, you can then apply again for the degree you really want. University of Wollongong Summer Master Class 2024

Applications Close 15th October

Our 3-week Summer Master Class program allows you to complete a university subject and secure at minimum a UOW admission interview to kick start your higher education journey.

Students who successfully pass their Summer Master Class subject will at minimum be guaranteed a conditional offer or admissions interview to a degree that aligns to the Summer Master Class subject they complete (noting must meet the assumed subject knowledge criteria).

Credit towards a UOW degree that could make you eligible to skip a whole subject when you study at UOW.

[University of Sydney ARTiculate – Ancient History: Pompeii – Recent archaeological research in the ancient city](#)

14 November

Presented by Roman archaeologist Dr Sophie Hay, who is currently working for the Parco Archeologico di Pompei (the Archaeological Park of Pompeii) and is ideally placed to discuss current investigations. Dr Hay is a member of the official social media team of Pompeii and publicly shares the archaeology of Pompeii through the official X account.

This talk will review the current research focus within Pompeii, especially following excavations in the Regio V area and recent conservation work on houses across the city. Dr Hay will highlight latest theories and new evidence to assist HSC students with their core HSC Ancient History study of the cities of Vesuvius, including her own recent publication on the hustle and bustle of city life in Pompeii.

Participants are required to attend all scheduled sessions within the 5 day Miroma Bunbilla Program. Should you miss any scheduled activity you will not qualify to be considered for entry to the JMP through this pathway. The Miroma Bunbilla Program 2023 will be delivered face-to-face. The program is designed to give you an insight into studying medicine in the JMP. You'll learn about the skills required in the program and participate in problem-based and group-based learning. Participants will collaborate and complete assessment tasks via online study groups. Participants will have the opportunity to participate in the program at either the University of Newcastle (Callaghan) or the University of New England (Armidale).

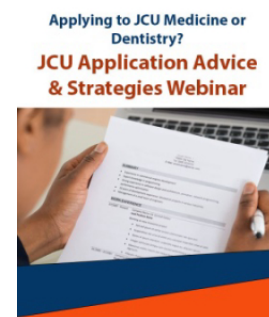

However, this year a written application for dentistry will be used as part of the selection process. Also, 3 letters of support will be used for dentistry and medicine as part of the selection criteria to the next stage which is the medical interview. If also applying for medicine at JCU, you need to be well aware and well-versed across the areas of Indigenous, rural, and tropical health issues in rural and remote medicine for the medical interview step.
